Minutes of the December 6, 2021 Meeting

Gamma Eta Chapter held its meeting on December 6, 2021 at 5:30 p.m. at First United Methodist Church, Spur. In attendance were the following members: Donna Anderson, K Dee Anderson, Debbi Ball, Terri Egerton, Pat Hightower, Brenda Karr, Sharon McDougle, Chelsea Read, Jean Williams, and new member Candace Zarate. Attending by ZOOM were Tiffany Harkins, Rhea Melton, Cristy McClenny and Janie Wigley. Guests present were Samantha Hardin and Area 12 Coordinator Sonja Hanks from Snyder. Mrs. Hanks brought greeting from Texas State Organization President Shalan Inmon and shared information concerning the TSO Lubbock Convention scheduled for June 2022. Volunteer are needed for Table Hostesses and Table Sales. Anyone interested in volunteering can contact Sonja. Sharon McDougle is in charge of registration, Terri Egerton in charge of posters and signs, Rhea Melton will be in the Property Room and Stephanie Martinez has volunteered where needed.

Following her announcements, Mrs. Hanks presented a program entitled "Underground Railroad Quilt Symbols: Fact or Folklore". Over a 9 month period Hanks had attended a quilting class in Lubbock where she pieced together a quilt with symbols that told the story of slaves seeking freedom during the Civil War. Each quilt square told a piece of the story of how quilts played an important role in guiding those seeking freedom a way of escape.

After the program, Terri Egerton of Lubbock called the meeting to order. Minutes were approved as printed in Gamma Eta News. Treasurer Sharon McDougle reported a balance of \$2, 161.96. Sharon also reported that she had "Brags for Grant" money to be deposited. Members voted to approve the use of the Prospect Card. Candace Zarate was introduced as a candidate for membership. Debbi Ball made a motion that we accept Candace as a member; Brenda Karr seconded the motion. The vote to approve Candace for membership was unanimous. Members were encouraged to pick up prospect cards and look for women educators to invite for membership.

K Dee Anderson reported that a letter was being prepared to mail to the school districts in Cottle, Crosby, Dickens, Kent, King and Motley Counties inviting educators to send proposed projects to our chapter with one or more being chosen for funding. Nomination of Officers will need to be submitted to Debbi Ball before our January 10, 2022 meeting. Officers will be elected at our March meeting as the 2022-2024 Slate of Officers have to be reported on March 15, 2022.

Debbi Ball reported that Visitor Samantha Hardin will be apply for the Aspiring Educator Grant and will apply for Collegial Membership. Donna Anderson reported that Gamma Eta Bylaws have been submitted to the TSO Bylaws Chair, Paula Miller.










Sonja Hanks, Area 12 Coordinator, presented program "Underground Railroad Quilt Symbols: Fact or Folklore".
