Melinda Jayne (Lindy) Armstrong Stafford was born on June 17th, 1944 to Lewis and Loutitia Armstrong in Dallas, Texas. She graduated from Hillerest High School in Dallas and attended Texas Christian University. It was there at ICU that she met her "country boy", Gale Stafford and what a match they were. Lindy often told the story of her first visit to the Stafford family. Being a "city girl" Lindy was new to ranch life. Her first meal at the Stafford's home cansisted of the biggest platter of chicken fried steak she'd ever seen, it took a lot to feed those Stafford boys! She laughed and said that one can of tuna would feed her and her mom for 3 days! Being around 3 rowdy Stafford boys didn't scare her away though. She and Gale married on January 31, 1964. After several years in East Texas, Gale and Lindy moved back to Matador with Wesley and David in 1973. Lindy fell in love with Matador and its people. She put down deep roots. It was at that point Lindy returned to school and graduated from Texas Tech. She began her teaching career at Motley County ISD in 1977. Ms. Lindy, as she was lovingly known by her students, was passionate about education. She had high expectations for her students, but more importantly, in her kind but firm way, she taught the students to have high expectations for themselves. Even though she had a family at home that needed her, Lindy always made, the time to work with any student and on the many school activities that fall in a teachers lap. She believed in the importance of UIL competitions and worked firelessly to help the kids from Motley County have success. She spent late nights going over writing samples or listening to poems and prose being practiced. She knew the importance of giving kids a firm foundation before college and taught college level English classes at night for local and surrounding area kids. Ms. Lindy made her share of nachos and hot dogs at concession stands, took gate money at ballgames, sponsored classes and field trips and most importantly truly loved the ki



Lindy retired in 2014 after 34 years. Her service to the kids of Motley County didn't stop. She has willingly and graciously served on the Motley County School board for the past 4 years. Lindy was often the calm voice of reason on the board. Because of her vast knowledge and experience with the school system fellow board members had a deep respect for her. An active member of the Matador United Methodist Church, Lindy served on numerous committees and loved her church family. Lindy loved to travel with friends and family. She had a special bond with her sisters-in-law. Julia and Diana, all wives of those Stafford boys, and spoke often of the yearly trips to Ruidoso they took together and all the fun they had. She loved the mountains of New Mexico and spent many summers with her family at her favorite destination, "the cabin" at Sipapu. Nothing made Lindy prouder than the men and husbands her boys became. She and Gale instilled in them strong Christian values and morals, manners and the kind hearts that they both possessed. She knew they had made wise choices and are genuinely good men. Her 4 grandsons were the apple of her eye. She was immensely proud of the job that Wesley and Tammi and David and Cynthia have done in raising her grandsons. Lindy loved attending all their many activities and sporting events. Living close to the school, one of her great joys was having an apen house for Cameron and Andrew every day at lunch. Lindy was preceded in death by her husband, Gale, in 2003 and by her parents. She is survived by her two sons and their wives, Wesley and Tammi Stafford of Sweetwater and David and Cynthia Stafford of Roaring Springs; her four grandsons, whom she cherished, Connor Stafford of College Station and Andrew Stafford of Roaring Springs; one brother-in-law, Richard Stafford; two sisters-in-law Diana Stafford and Shirley Gilliam; several nieces and nephews.
